PA GAME COMMISSION - Mike Yeck

- Four electronic devices have been approved for hunting. Final approval will not be legal until the changes are published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin which will take approx. 6 - 8 weeks.
- Enhanced game lands access sought for those with mobility issues.
- Air guns & semi auto use extended to special regulations areas.
- Commissioners Putnam and Schlemmer have stepped down.
- Pheasant season starts Oct 7, with changes.
- The Game Commission's Executive Order banning importation of unprocessed harvested deer from any state that has 1 or more counties known to have CWD will NOT go into effect for this deer season.

EVENTS COORDINATOR - Craig Holdren

- Every time I have requested photos for league events I have set a limit of 24 to 36 photos per event. I've been as clear as I can be. I've asked you to pick out the best photos you want posted.
 - I recently received a photo submission of 2149 pictures for an unknown number of league events. This is ridiculous, especially when I've been specific with my requests. There was little or no organization to the photos which means I have no idea what event each picture was for. We never agreed for me or the webmaster to spend hours looking over pictures for posting.
 - Furthermore, out of the 2149 submitted photos, there were only 200 quality shots that were good enough to be posted. The rest were duplicates or bad photos.
 - When we agreed to do the website with our webmaster, we set up boundaries so that both parties would be happy with the arrangement. Your time is valuable, and so is ours. This example certainly does not fit within those boundaries.
- To reiterate, this is what we need when you submit pictures:
 - Event title and date with no more than 36 pictures per event.
 - A short description of the event and those people responsible for the event with their contact information.
 - The pictures should be in a folder that has the name of the event and date. (examples: 2017 Action Day, or 2017 Youth Conservation Camp).
- Bottom line, if I get another photo submission like this, I'll just send it back. Then, if you don't see your event pictures on the website, you'll know why.

LEGISLATIVE - Bob Oles

- Since Sunday's Las Vegas mass shooting, the predictable calls from democrats and liberals for more gun control are coming hot and heavy. As horrible as this shooting was, we have to keep it in perspective and not let what one or more deranged people did, affect the Constitutional Rights of the rest of us.
 - For instance, in the city of Chicago for the month of September alone, 330 people were shot, of which, 57 of them died. Where were the incessant calls for gun control about this? The big cities with the strictest gun control, such as New York, Chicago and Los Angeles have the highest murder and violent crime. [Article](#)

 - The NRA believes that devices designed to allow semi-automatic rifles to function like fully-automatic rifles should be subject to additional regulation.
