NEW SEWICKLEY TOWNSHIP MEETING - Tony Rich

- One of the township supervisors lives close enough to Rochester Sportsmen's Club that he is bothered by the noise of legal hunting of crows on Sunday mornings that is taking place on club property. This supervisor was planning on introducing a noise ordinance that would have imposed restrictions on this activity. We got wind of this, so myself, a couple of Rochester club members and Bob Oles attended their June township meeting to oppose this.
- I opposed the planned noise ordinance on the grounds that a township has no authority to change any aspect of hunting that is approved federally, which hunting crows as a nuisance bird is legal in Title 34 of the United States Code of Federal Regulations, or statewide which is approved by the Pennsylvania Game Commission.
- Craig was originally going to address the supervisors and he had started preparing for that but a back injury sidelined him so Bob Oles, with planning help from Firearms Owners Against Crime's Kim Stolfer, opposed the planned noise ordinance from the standpoint that a township has no authority to control any aspect of legal operation of firearms due to Pennsylvania being a Preemption State. No governing body except the Pennsylvania legislature has the authority to control firearms or ammunition. Title 18 Section 6120. And gun / sportsmen's club are immune to any noise ordinances that weren't in effect at the time the club was constructed. Title 35 Sections 4501 and 4502. *Handout to Twp Supervisors*
- The result No new noise ordinances will be forth coming from New Sewickley Township.

LEGISLATIVE - Bob Oles

- The State House Judiciary Committee held a hearing on Pennsylvania Gun laws and violence on May 22. There were 9 separate anti-gun groups that were in attendance calling for more gun control. There were 2 groups, Firearms Owners Against Crime, represented by Chairman Kim Stolfer, and the Prince Law Firm.
- Think about this for a minute. Nine anti-gun groups testifying for more gun control in Pennsylvania. And one pro-gun group and one pro-gun law firm. That's it. No national gun organizations to represent you, to advocate for your freedom, the average Pennsylvania gun owner. If you've heard of the oppressive gun laws and virtual persecution of gun owners in some of the surrounding states like New York, New Jersey and Maryland, you need to understand, one of the biggest reasons the state you live in isn't like those, is the advocacy of this group and Kim Stolfer.
- Please take a few minutes, watch the <u>Video of Kim's Testimony</u> to the Judiciary committee, read his <u>Written Testimony</u> submitted to the committee, and read his <u>Email Blast</u> to Firearms Owners Against Crime's membership.
- And then, not only be thankful we have such a knowledgable and dedicated defender of the 2nd Amendment, but also, help him and this organization out by joining and becoming a member. *FOAC Application*
