STATE AGENCIES

PA GAME COMMISSION - Matt Kramer

- Each item listed is a short synopsis of Matt's report. Link for Matt's report.
- 2019-20 Hunting/Trapping Seasons Approved.
- Perhaps one of the biggest changes is the new opening day for the firearms deer season, which will be the Saturday following Thanksgiving.
- Antlerless deer license allocations for WMU 2A = 46,000. Down from 49,000 last year. WMU 2B = 54,000 down from 58,000 last years.
- 142 elk licenses will be issued. 32 antlered and 110 antlerless will be awarded by lottery. Two additional elk seasons and lottery drawings for licenses have been added. Hunters must apply separately for all the seasons they wish to be eligible to hunt. Each application costs \$11.90.
- The PGC adopted a slate of deer seasons for 2019-20 including a split, six-day antlers deer season from Nov 30 Dec 6 and a seven day concurrent season from Dec 7-14 in 20 Wildlife Management Units.
- Fall Turkey Season Changes Adopted. In WMU's 1A, 2A, 4A & 4B is one week, Nov 2-9, plus a two day Thanksgiving season Nov 28 & 29.
- Fluorescent Orange requirements were simplified and will become effective in the license year 2019-20 to begin July 1.
- The PGC is 100% committed to putting into place measures to manage CWD. We have heard from hunters and legislators in the Bedford and Blair Counties over their opposition to our efforts to control CWD in this region. We took a step back to re-evaluate a better path forward.
- Trappers using snares might soon have more direct guidance on the types of locks that can be used on the devises.
- World champion turkey caller and television personality, Matt Morrett is now the PGC's new marketing specialist. He will help to keep existing hunters involved and attract more newcomers to the hunting tradition.
- The PGC Board of Commissioners met with the State House Game and Fisheries Committee to discuss the Saturday opener for the 2019 deer season. The PGC will analyze results of this new opening day to see if the overall affect was beneficial or not and then decide whether to continue with this new opening day in 2020 and beyond.

PA FISH & BOAT COMMISSION - Jeremy Allen

- Opening week-end wasn't too bad this year. A lot of campers at Brady's Run and most people were well behaved.
- There are two more in season stockings. One at Brady's Run and another at Raccoon Creek State Park.
- Lake Erie creel limits for yellow perch will remain at 30/day and for walleye 6/day.
- Commissioners encouraged the public to participate in a survey that will assist in forming the agency's new strategic plan. Visit the main page of <u>www.fishandboat.com</u> through May 10. - River temperatures are starting to rise.
- A 40 pound catfish was caught the other day.
- Walleye and Sauger season opens this Saturday May 4th. Creel limit is 6. Walleye need to be 15 inches and Sauger need to be 12 inches to harvest.

- PGC Commissioner Jim Delay, from Butler County, resigned from his Board position on 4/9/19.
- PGC gave preliminary approval to use the 6.5mm rounder for elk hunting. Final vote at the July meeting.
- PGC added 100 acres to its game lands 176 in the Penn State area. Additional land was purchased in the Chester County area.

- Jerry Hooks donated \$100.00 for the stocking of 20" plus fish and provided a prize if caught
- Andy Theodore of Strictly Fishing Charters donated a 3 person walleye fishing charter that was won by an 11 year old boy from Aliquippa.

- Pittsburgh's Illegal Gun Control. Handout
 - The Mayor and six members of City Council are being sued by, Firearms Owners Against Crime (FOAC), Allegheny County Sportsmen's League, Firearms Policy Coalition (FPC), Firearms Policy Foundation (FPF), and three individuals.
 - State Representative Daryl Metcalfe is calling for the impeachment of Mayor Peduto.

 - Considering the onslaught we are facing from billionaire funded anti-gun groups, sometimes the payoff is not in a gain, but in limiting the damage

- We are going to 2nd Amendment Rally in Harrisburg, Monday, May 6, in an effort to protect our Right to Keep & Bear Arms. We will present to legislators, a list of anti-gun bills that we ask them to not support. Such as Register & Tax all Firearms Annually, HB768. Extreme Risk Protection Orders, HB1028 / HB1075 / SB90 / SB293, better known as Gun Confiscation Orders. And Licensing Firearms Ownership, HB467 / SB344.
- We will also present to legislators a list of pro-gun bills that we ask them to support. Such as Strengthening Pennsylvania Firearm Preemption Law, HB1066 / SB531. which would go a long way to preventing the flagrant violation of current preemption law that we currently see taking place in Pittsburgh.

• Craig - Attended the NRA Convention in Indianapolis, IN.

- At the convention, Trump signed the documents necessary to order the "unsigning" of the United Nations Arms Trade Treaty which effectively withdraws the United States from that treaty.

- Reminded all teams to visit Speaker of the House Turzai and State Rep. Cutler about their broken promise to not run any anti-gun legislation. After that we ended up with HB2060 a Protection from Abuse bill that has elements of Red Flag Laws in it.
